Dear members of St. John the Baptist parish,

I hope this finds you well and I thank you for your loving connection to St John's. I would like to share a Scripture with you to begin this invitational letter. It is from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians:

"As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit, we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." (1 Cor 12:12-13)

In this Scripture the word "parts" is used, but it could also be translated as "members." This Scripture highlights that our membership in the church begins when we are baptized. When baptized, our original and personal sins are washed away, we become members of the Body of Christ, we receive the Holy Spirit and thus become Temples of the Holy Spirit, and God considers us His adopted and beloved sons and daughters. After being created and born, Baptism is the most beautiful thing that can happen in our lives. Once baptized, the Holy Spirit continues to call us and enable us to live as baptized believers in our daily lives. God calls each of us in unique, yet connected ways, to do this.

"Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body." (1Cor 12:14-20)

For the Body of Christ, the Church, to be healthy and effective in the work of the salvation of souls, each member must also be active, connected, and spiritually healthy. And like good friends do, we encourage each other to be the best version of ourselves and contribute to the good of others.

Our community is embarking upon a transformational journey of Information, Invitation, and Accompaniment. This resource is our attempt to highlight, communicate, and emphasize what "Active Membership" in our community looks like. I have seen how one active member can change a parish. Can you imagine what a community of active members could do? I'm pretty sure we could change the world. And that is what Jesus calls us to do, change the world by bringing forth his Kingdom of justice, love, and peace. Thank you for embarking upon this transformational journey of active membership in the Body of Christ!
